Why we pay dues to Heartland Sertoma? As a member of our club, you are part of a larger network of over 600 Sertoma Clubs throughout North America, with about 16,000 members. All members pay dues to their local clubs, making them part of their districts (our is Kansas District), part of their regions (our is the Heart of America) and part of the international organization – Sertoma International.

You are provided member services at all these levels: District Governors providing regular newsletters, training, visits and networking; regionally leadership provided on the national board by a regional director, who provides a fall convention with additional training for the region, networking and friendships; and finally from Sertoma International, a wealth of information, training, conferences, annual convention, non-profit status, liability insurance for our fund raisers, and services to all of us by way of the quarterly magazine, *The Sertoman*, news publication *The Sertoma Digest*, and e-blasts with news around Sertomaland.

All of this costs money. Our club pays dues to our District Governor, Regional Director and sertoma HQ based on a per-member basis. Part of the dues YOU pay goes to these three important areas of Sertoma.

Since our club pays dues on our behalf, we benefit from all these services. It is OUR obligation to pay dues to our club for these services from which we benefit.

Along with the privilege of helping others, networking, developing leadership skills, learning, training, FUN, comes the obligation of paying dues. THANKS for your timely payments!
