# Our July 9<sup>th</sup> Program In Detail .....

We are in for a treat next Tuesday, July 9<sup>th</sup>. A great time to invite a prospective member to join you! At noon, meet us at the Kansas Air National Guard Museum, 6700 S. Topeka Blvd., Bldg 301. Topeka Blvd South to main entrance of Forbes Field where you will then turn east. There is a HUGE KC-124 refueling tanker jet parked at the entrance with other equipment on display – you can't miss it! If you are at Heartland Park raceway – you've gone too far!

The Kansas Nat'l Guard Museum opened in 1997 and was formerly Forbes Air Base. It is dedicated to preserving the 157 year militia heritage of the citizen soldiers of the Ks Army Air Nat'l Guard including those who serve in the Kansas Volunteer Militia. Open from 10am to 4pm Tues-Sat. there is no admission charge. A life-sized bronze Kansas Minuteman greets you as you



enter.

The Museum includes over 120 interior exhibits from the Civil War to the Global War on Terrorism. A 6-acre outdoor display area features over 30 pieces of equipment of the Kansas Army & Air Nat'l Guard including an M-1 tank, KC-125 refueling Tanker, F-4 fighter air-craft, RB-57 bomber, six helicopters, five artillery pieces, variety of trucks.

Brigadier General (ret'd) Ed Gerhardt will be presenting to us the purpose of the museum, and allowing us to enjoy its content. He is the President and Operations Officer of the Ks Nat'l Guard Museum. He served over 38 years in the Ks Army Nat'l Guard, retiring in 1998 as the Asst. Adjutant General, Army, and Commander of the Ks Army Nat'l Guard. Among his awards were the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service Medal and Army Commendation Medal. He was also a principal in Kansas schools for over 39 years, including Perry-Lecompton, Emporia and Santa Fe Trail, retiring from education in 2008.
